Referring to your letter in this matter of the 23rd February

I am to request that a Notice in the enclosed form may be affixed to or near a principal outer door of the Parish Church of Langford and of some other public building in the Parish, and may remain so affixed for at least fifteen days. I am also to request that a copy of the proposed Scheme, three printed copies of which are enclosed herewith, may be deposited for gratuitous public inspection at some suitable place in the Parish during the period prescribed for the publication of the Notice. Particulars of the place of deposit should be inserted in the Notice prior to publication.

The Forms of Declaration, endorsed upon the enclosed duplicate forms of Notice should, at the expiration of the period of publication, be filled up, signed, and returned to this Office.

I am to explain that in the case of the Poor's Allotment the Scheme will be established under the juris-

diction conferred upon the Commissioners by section 18 of the Commons Act 1899 and that for this purpose a further application made by the Parish Council in the manner indicated below will for technical reasons be required.

A form for the purpose is enclosed and should be signed at a meeting of the Parish Council by the Chairman presiding at the Meeting and two other members of the Council.

I am to inquire whether it is correctly understood that Messrs. Charles Edmonds and Frederick Edwin Whitfield, who signed the application received on the 24th February last, are Trustees appointed by the Parish Council and, if so, whether they were appointed to be Trustees of all the Charities named in the proposed Scheme. The dates of the meetings of the Parish Council at which the persons named were appointed should also be stated.
