EXTRACT FROM THE WILL OF MISS EDITH MARIANNE HOBBS DEC'D.

I GIVE to the Trustees for the time being of The Langford Coal Charity the sum of Three hundred Pounds free of duty and I commit to their keeping the care and charge of my Mother's Sarah Elizabeth Hobbs' tomb in the Parish Churchyard of Andover in the County of Hants and also my Father's William Frampton Hobbs' tomb in the Parish Churchyard of Langford aforesaid and also the following graves and tombs of the Akerman family enclosed in one curb in the Parish Churchyard at Langford in the County of Oxford, that is to say, John Rhodes Akerman, Mary Ann Akerman, William Akerman, Susan Grace Akerman, Susan Ann Akerman, Mary Jane Akerman, and Alice Jane Akerman, and I Request them to keep the aforesaid tombs and graves in good repair and the inscriptions thereon legible and to rebuild same when requisite. Failing their compliance with this request I Give the said sum of Three hundred Pounds to the Charity known as Day's Charity at Langford aforesaid.
