Area of benefit the Parish of Langford

Objects description Distribution of coal among twelve poor widows and
widowers, natives and residents in the parish.

the said Robert Day's will of 24th September, 1869, in
which he directs that such poor and parishioners for
the time being do and shall stand possessed of
and interested in the same upon trust to receive
the dividends and annual proceeds thereof from
time to time when and as the same shall become
due and payable and pay and apply such
dividends and annual proceeds towards the
purchase of coal and so distribute or cause to be
distributed the coal so to be purchased by them as
may seem to them to be necessary in each and
every year as near to that as may be equally
between and amongst 12 of the poor widows and
widowers of the Parish of Langford aforesaid such
widows and widowers being natives of and residents
in the said parish of Langford at the time of the

above sum of which was transferred to the official
 Custodian of Churchable Funds on the 21st of the 4th
 month.

Robert Gays Charity.

Robert Gay of Longford, Berks, by his will of
 this date, and proved in the District Registry at Exeter
 21st September 1869 made the following bequest:-
 To give and bequeath the sum of £100 Sterling
 unto the vicar and churchwardens for the time
 being of the parish of Longford in the County of
 Berkshire such sum to be paid to and applied
 by them as soon as conveniently may be after
 the decease in the purchase of 2 1/2 per cent. South
 Sea Annuities or some Government Security but
 direct that such vicar and churchwardens for
 the time being do and shall stand possessed of
 and interested in the same upon trust to receive
 the dividends and annual proceeds thereof from
 time to time when and as the same shall become
 due and payable and pay and apply such
 dividends and annual proceeds towards the
 purchase of coal and so distribute or cause to be
 distributed the said coal to be purchased by them as
 measured on the 1st day of January in each and
 every year as near to that as may be equalling
 between and amongst 12 of the Poor Aldermen and
 Aldewes of the Parish of Longford aforesaid such
 Aldermen and Aldewes being natives of and residents
 in the said parish of Longford at the time of the

distribution thereof and such 12 widows and
students to be selected by and at the discretion
of the said Vicar and Churchwardens?

Under the authority of the Board of Charity
Commissioners the sum of £90 being the value
of the legacy after payment of Duty, was paid
to the Banking Account of "The Official Trustees of
Charitable Funds" and pursuant to an order of
the Board dated 22nd February 1870, the sum of
£90. 3. 3 Three pence and three farthings, purchased thereon
was transferred to the Official Trustees on the
following day.

Thorney School.

By Indenture dated 11th May 1841, Enrolled
in Chancery 30th July following, and made
between John Augustus Sullivan Esq. of the
one part, and the Rev^d William Gay, The Rev^d
William Green, the Rev^d Frederick Edwards
Baptist, the Rev^d Thomas Burne Lancaster, the
Rev^d Edward Langton Ward and the Rev^d
William Francis Ward, Clerics, of the other
part As the said J. A. Sullivan in consideration
of 5/- by the other parties bargained and sold a
piece of land containing by admeasurement
27 perches or thereabouts situate at Thorney in
the Parish of Deer with the appurtenances there-
unto belonging, and more particularly describe
in the plan, unto the said parties of the other
part their heirs and assigns for ever In trust

ROBERT DAY'S CHARITY

Robert Day of Faringdon Berks by his will of this date and proved in the District Registry at Oxford on 24th September 1869 made the following bequest: "I give and bequeath the sum of £100 sterling unto the Vicar and Churchwardens of the time being of the parish of Langford in the county of Berkshire such sum to be paid to and applied by them as soon as conveniently may be after my decease in the purchase of £3% Consolidated Bank annuities or some government security and I direct such Vicar and Churchwardens for the time being do and shall stand possessed and interested in the same upon trust to receive the dividends and annual proceeds thereof from time to time when and as the same shall become due and payable And pay and apply such dividends and annual proceeds aforesaid in the purchase of coal and so distribute or cause to be distributed the coal so to be purchased by them as aforesaid on the 23rd day of January in each and every year or as near to that as maybe be equally divided between and amongst twelve of the poor widows and widowers of the parish of Langford aforesaid such widows and widowers being natives of and residents in the said parish of Langford at the time of the distributions thereof and such twelve widows and widowers to be selected by and at the discretion of the said vicar and churchwardens."

Under the authority of the Board of Charity Commissioners the sum of £90 being the balance of the legacy after payment of duty was paid to the banking account of "the Official Trustee of Charitable Funds" and pursuant to an order of the Board dated 22nd February 1870 the sum of £97.3.3. 3% Consols purchased therewith was transferred to the Official Trustee on the following day.
